Camp Phoenix is the name of MetroHealth Burn Center's Burn Camp for children. The regional burn center at MetroHealth Center serves residents of Northern Ohio, parts of Western Pennsylvania and beyond. The center is a 16 bed unit, self-contained to provide specialized care for inpatient treatment. Outpatient service is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week for burn victims. Physicians, nurses,

pharmacists, nutritionists, occupational and physical therapists, social workers, music therapists and members of the clergy make up the burn team. The center is the only burn facility in Northern Ohio, which provides primary care, teaching, training and research in burn injuries and is verified by the American Burn Association and the American College of Surgeons.



What is the Aluminum Cans for Burned Children Foundation and How Does it Help Burn Survivors?



ACBC is a non-profit aluminum beverage can recycling program founded by The Northern Ohio Fire Fighters and The Northeast Ohio Fire Chiefs Association. The program is sponsored by MetroHealth Medical Center of Cleveland, schools, businesses, residents and fire departments throughout Northeast Ohio.

50% of the Foundation's income comes from recycled aluminum cans.

ACBC's programs include:

- Fire Safety Houses
- Camp Phoenix Summer & Winter Camps
- Scholarship Program

ACBC also provides rehabilitation, clothing, toys, games, computer and video equipment, and miscellaneous other items not covered by insurance.

What Your Can Means

The aluminum cans you throw away or place on the curb side could bring joy into the life of a burned child.

Through the Aluminum Cans for Burned Children Foundation, aluminum cans are collected and recycled.

The proceeds are used for fire safety education, a summer and winter camp for burn survivors, and to buy non-medical items not covered by insurance, such as special protective clothing or bicycles that help injured children exercise burned arms and legs. 50% of the proceeds used for these programs come from recycled cans.

That's a lot of cans. It takes 28 cans to make one pound of aluminum. Each pound of recycled aluminum is currently worth approximately 35¢.

Summer and Winter Adventure

Since 1988, burn survivors from age 5 to 16 have been able to enjoy a free, four-day retreat at Camp Phoenix, which is operated by ACBC and the staff of the Burn Unit at Cleveland's MetroHealth Medical Center.

Camp Phoenix is held at Camp Christopher in Bath, Ohio. Children who share the experience of recovering from serious burns are able to hike, swim, play baseball, and enjoy themselves in general.

They also hear from other burn survivors who have successfully recovered.

Fire Safety Education

National statistics show children five and under are the age group most likely to die in a fire.

One of the goals of the ACBC Foundation is to educate young children and their older brothers and sisters about the danger of playing with matches and to show them what to do if there is a fire in their home. They also hear from other burn survivors who have successfully recovered from their burn injuries.



We do this through our Fire Safety House. The Fire Safety House is a 28-foot trailer built to resemble a two-story home. It has a living room, bedroom, and kitchen.

ACBC operates two Fire Safety Houses. Northeast Ohio school children tour the Fire Safety Houses monthly.
